Dear Members and Friends,

It was business as usual for the 22-23 Season, beginning with our Carol Service in St Oswald's Church on Christmas Day. Apart from the two pandemic years, this unique service in the Alps, has been going since 1965, so it was so good to be back in the beautiful St Oswald's church with Fr Franz officiating and our two Army Regimental teams as sidesmen.

The season opened in December with all the lifts in operation when and we were able to ski to the bottom of the Wiedersbergerhorn and Pöglbahn lifts each day, while so many other European resorts remained closed until well into the New Year. All this thanks to our hard working Lift Company, their investment in to the new reservoir and the fact that, in Alpbach, we ski over fields and not on scree or rocky slopes where much deeper snow is necessary.

Our children remain in the heart of the Club and here we had a good year, albeit it with reduced Half Term numbers; it is always good to watch the improvement in the course of the training weeks with the credit going to our wonderful instructors and the children themselves, who always tackle the weeks with such enthusiasm. The good snow stayed with us for the season giving us both on and off-piste skiing at both Half Term and Easter and quite remarkably the ability to ski down at the end of the day on hard pistes in April. To round off our season, we had Open Races at the end of our training weeks and a third during a jolly Club Weekend in March.

Racing training continues for some of our children with some good results in UK and Europe and we are delighted to tell you that after a lot hard work both Darcy Davies and Angus Matheson have, against tough competition, been selected for the GB squad. As in UK, the employment scene in Austria, remains difficult with employers struggling to fill seasonal vacancies and cost increases, inevitably impacting our prices. The situation for British gap year students remains difficult with few work permits available. Despite the economic gloom our finances remain robust and we face the new season with confidence.

Earlier this year, we welcomed Lulu Adams and James Ferguson onto the Committee. As well as reducing the average age of the Committee dramatically, they are already having a very positive influence elsewhere, organising an early November get-together for the young, leading our research for systems to simplify and manage our administration and raising our social media profile. Thanks also go to other Committee Members who work quietly behind the scenes but do so much to keep us in good shape. And of course, our sponsors, Sepp and the Alpbach Ski School and Conny's Sport who give us so much support throughout the season. Ski School help is not just limited to their marvellous instructors who bring our children on so well but also with our own end of week races which require separate timing and course management. And Conny's Sport who fully support the Club Weekend with prizes and continue to offer AVSC members a generous 20% discount for internet ski hire and discounts in their shops. The new season starts with our return to the Royal Thames Yacht Club in Knightsbridge on Thursday 16 November for our Autumn Drinks and we hope to see many members and friends there and of course in Alpbach throughout the year.
