

Ski Juwel Alpbachtal Wildschönau, Alpbach and the Wildschönau are joining forces for a bright new future in merging their ski areas. From December 2012 the new ski area, with the appealing name "Ski Juwel" will offer snow sports lovers 145 kilometers of pistes, 47 lifts, 3 Terrain Parks and one new connecting piste. There will be a new 8 person gondola next to the Pöglbahn bottom station in Inneralpbach to below the Pechalm, where a middle station will be built and will then continue to the top station on the Schatzberg (1,903 metres).

Statement from Markus Kofler, Head of Alpbachtal-Seenland:

We of the Tourismusverband Alpbachtal Seenland are very pleased about the opening of the new Ski resort "Ski Juwel Alpbachtal Wildschönau" with 145 km of pistes. With the new Ski connection we are able to expand our range significantly and can offer a competitive ski area, which gives the skiers a greater range of possibilities. To keep up one must develop. Todays guests have greater expectations that is a challenge for us. With the joining of the ski areas Alpbachtal – Wildschönau we have catapulted us into the future and are now one of the 10 largest ski resorts in Tirol.

Restaurant News The Hallenbad (swimming pool) and Restaurant has been closed for the foreseeable future. However Flo's Restaurant has moved to where Am Eck was, just past the Post Hotel, and will continue to provide their excellent meals.

BLESMA & CSDST

We continued supporting our two chosen charities, The British Limbless Ex Service-Men's Association (BLESMA) and The Combined Services Disabled Ski Team (CSDST), last season for our second year

BLESMA were again in Sölden in early March 2012 for their annual skibob camp and tell us they had "a fantastic week" and are already planning their return from 22 February to 1 March in 2013. They have expressed their appreciation to AVSC for the skibob donated by the Club and the Most Improved Newcomer trophy.

It is a tribute to all those who attend the rehabilitation week that they are ready and waiting for the first lift at 08:20 every morning. The snow was good and the weather kind allowing some to compete up to 28 runs in a day. Their camp was not without a touch of danger with one of the skibobbers crashing and sustaining concussion, followed by a 24 hour stay in hospital for observation – he has fully recovered but his helmet has not!

Keith Walker our Most Improved Newcomer from 2011 returned again and was nominated as the "most improved ski-bobber". He is progressing well towards becoming an instructor. The AVSC trophy for the Most Improved Newcomer in 2012 was awarded to Jeff Winder. Well done Jeff and Keith.

CSDST continues to do an amazing job feeding novice disabled skiers into a development programme, much of which is run at indoor Snow Centres across the UK. This provides the basic skills and technique training and increases skiers' experience and confidence on snow, prior to those who

wish to take their skiing further attending a Skills Camp in Austria in November each year. At the end of this camp elementary ski racing techniques are taught and "race gates" introduced. Those showing aptitude and a desire to progress further, are then able to participate in the full range of military alpine races up to the Inter Service Championships. The skiers who show real promise are then encouraged to race at Europa Cup level and, if they achieve the requisite points, may then be invited to join the British Disabled Ski Team (BDST). This will see them participating in a range of international disabled races at Europa/ NORAM/Southern Hemisphere Cup levels before progressing on to World Cup and Paralympic competition. CSDST is targeting the Paralympic Games in Sochi 2014 and hopes to have several athletes representing Great Britain

At the CSDST end of season dinner Paula and Jeremy Walker kindly agreed at the last moment to represent the Club and to present the AVSC Most Improved Trophy. The winner this year was ex Royal Signals Sergeant Mick Brennan. Mick is a double amputee and as such is a "sit skier", racing in a similar rig to that used by Sepp Margreiter on the Alpbach slopes. Mick is already competing at World Cup Standard and is a serious contender for a place in the team for Sochi 2014.

Junior Club Training

We had a great season of ski training with super snow and high numbers of children. The weather was kind and although snow was a bit thin at Christmas, by Half Term it was the best for many years and lasted well into our Easter week despite a few very warm days. Some Alpbachers said it was the best snow for thirty years so we have our fingers crossed for 2013

The Junior Training Committee gauges success by improvement in skiing standards and by this measure we had a very good season with noticeable advancement in all classes; the timid gained confidence and the better skiers improved their techniques. We are pleased to see the improvement by all the kids but it does make the task of picking out the "most improved" children over the week far more difficult!

Our thanks to our partners, Sepp Margreiter and the Alpbach Ski School because the scale of improvement is mainly down to the ski school allowing us to select the top instructors and our small sized classes. The instructors were again led by Gerhard and his team who always put in a huge effort over our training weeks. Each year we ask them to put in extra hours with early morning course setting, our own early starts, additional work after skiing with video play back and at half term the extra work involved setting up the parallel slalom and then dismantling the course at the end. Our partnership gets stronger by the year.

Half Term

The half term school holidays worked really well for us with more schools than usual sharing the same week while fewer of the continental schools were on holiday over the same period. So while we welcomed more children than ever before, averaging 48 over the week, we still benefitted from unusually un-crowded half term pistes. We had a good mix of snow conditions with a combination of piste and some great powder snow, giving us the balance we need for our trainees to get all round experience enabling them to ski any conditions anywhere in future years.

The parallel slalom on the Wednesday evening saw some tight finishes. The snow was good for the competitors but bitterly cold for spectators. This is a fun event with children enjoying the opportunity to race against each other and towards the end challenge their parents – a great evening and our thanks to all those who supported the event. In particular it was good to have some former team GB racers there, including Dan Walker to give the children something to aspire to.



On Friday, race day, we had spit roasted chicken at the Bögalm before our own AVSC race on the Inneralpbach piste followed by prizegiving by the finish hut. There were some good performances and we congratulate James Mason and Immy Adams as our fastest boy and girl and our most improved candidates Alex de la Fuente, Hendrik van den Bout for the second year, Joe Ruston, Theo Barker, Rohan Bigham, Nancy Walker, Jamie Galbraith, William Kingham and Hollen Bailey. Well done Hollen and Jamie our over-all most improved girl and boy.

Easter

The snow held up well for Easter despite the very warm weather before we arrived and at the start of the week. Numbers were again good averaging 59 over the week making a total of 107 for the season. Ideal conditions gave the top classes the opportunity to ski the spring snow on the Greitalm, something perhaps not many parents have been able to try. We all enjoyed some new powder snow during the week and were able to have lunch at the Bögalm on the Inneralpbach slope, while it was just possible to ski down to the bottom. Our normal activities continued with some pole training and video with playback in the evenings. We introduced a better system for fitting blades at the top, allowing us to get all the classes onto blades for a half day.

We planned to hold the AVSC end of week race followed by the Open Race on Red 3 below the Hornboden with a finish above the Asthütte but overnight rain damage prevented us setting gates there, necessitating a move to the Red 13 run under the Kohlgruben Chair Lift. Even here the piste had deteriorated dramatically forcing us to cancel the Open Race on Friday morning as running the additional Open Race skiers over the same course would not have been possible. We take the opportunity to thank all those

who donated their entry fees to the Club. The conditions for the race were not ideal with thin cloud down the course flattening the light . The children tackled these testing conditions really well, putting to good use what had been learnt during the week. There were some excellent results taking into account the age and the lack of experience of some of the children, while others with a small mistake or a lack of concentration were punished by times that did not reflect their skills on the rest of the course.

We congratulate our Champions Mathew Mason and Immy Adams and our most improved nominees Hector Butcher, Will Rigby, Tom Pertwee, Rufus Hall, Sassy Hammersley, Gus Whitehead, Izzy Akroyd, Sophie Ollerenshaw and our Overall Most Improved Girl Kitty Rigby and Boy Fin Whitehead. The results were distributed with our usual warning. The race takes under a minute, a very small part of the whole week and although racing is not for all of us, we do it because all of the skills learnt during the week come together in this short race and we believe this small competitive element in the week does help push all the children on. Some of the results are exceedingly good; note some of the ages of the children in the finish order.

The better than expected numbers during the season turned our anticipated slight loss, or at best break-even, into a training surplus for the year and this means we will maintain our price of €240 for the 2013 Season

Finally we thank Paula and Jeremy Walker and Conny Margreiter for their sponsorship of our 2012 Most Improved awards. We look forward to seeing you again in 2013.




British Schoolboys Races 2012




