# Chairman's letter

#### Dear Members and Friends

I hope you are well and unscathed after months of very trying covid restrictions and that, despite everything, normality will resume for us all soon. We have not escaped the effects of the virus and, due to current restrictions, had to cancel the Autumn Drinks in London. Sadly, with just two weeks' notice, our Easter week had to be stopped in Mid-March when the Provincial Government ordered a Tyrol-wide lockdown. Worse still, and for the first time in over fifty years, there will be no AVSC Carol Service on Christmas Day in Alpbach due to the toughening of restrictions for church events.

After a slow start, your Club has had a good year. The February Half Term week was again popular with a daily average of 80 children. We had a strong team of instructors and, although we could have done with more powder snow, we got through all the other activities with 75 children for our end of week race and 51 for our Open Race. Some very good times were recorded including from our 7-8 year olds, who all raced the full Inneralpbach course.

Our adult racing had a cracking start in January when 12 teams entered the inaugural AJ Bell Courmayeur Classic, a two-day multi-discipline event. The Alpbach Allstars swept away the competition on Day 2, to emerge as overall winners. Spurred on by success in Courmayeur, we did it again at the AICC races in Flaine. Our entries, though fewer this year as some had been the backbone of the Alpbach Allstars, did brilliantly with our over 60s team, "the Old Farts", demolishing the competition to become category winners and claim their place on the Roll of Honour; this says much about their formative training in Alpbach.

When the AVSC Club weekenders convened on a Thursday evening in March, they were greeted with news that the Tyrol was to go into lockdown on Sunday evening with all accommodation to shut by Monday midday; the signal for the season's last hurrah! Although some had to cut and run, those staying pumped as much money into local hostelries as possible to make up for the season's early closure. It was a well organised weekend and once again we thank our friend Konny for his sponsorship.

Congratulations to Pat and Friedl Hausberger for their golden wedding anniversary in November. Many will remember Pat as Dinny's sidekick in the Alpbach Office. We also wish other Honorary Members, Marion and Ian Mills good fortune as they leave Alpbach to return to UK. In other news, Sarah Lewis, an AVSC trainee and member of the British Alpine Ski squad, has been unceremoniously dumped as FIS Secretary General after 20 years in post. We wish her luck in the future.

I take the opportunity to thank Sepp and the Alpbach Ski School, Konny and Conny's Sport for their continued support, your Committee, Joey our Club Secretary and those who organise our AICC teams and Club Weekends. They all work hard behind the scenes ensuring we enjoy the different events.

Although, with the wretched virus, we live in uncertainty, we are in good shape financially and, being optimistic, are planning a full season. We can take full advantage of Alpbach's multi million Euro investment in the new Kohlgrube reservoir.

As we go to press, the Austrian Government has still not issued guidelines to the ski industry but we can assure members that the Lift Company and Ski School have plans in place to protect us all, be it in the gondolas, on the slopes or in the mountain restaurants, so we look forward to seeing you all again in the coming season.

# Village news

As the Club Weekend started, on 12th March, the Tyrolean Provincial Government ordered lifts to close on the Sunday afternoon and "all accommodation providers" to shut by midday Monday. With the ski season brought to an abrupt end, and with the cancellation of all the usual Congress', there was a real threat to Alpbach's Summer season. However, with reports of full hotels and busy Gästhause, the Village benefitted from the many who stayed in Europe. Some were quick to adapt to the influx whilst maintaining social distancing.



Kohlgrube Reservoir Skiing in Alpbach will be greatly improved in the new season, as we benefit from the €5.5m investment by Alpbacher Bergbahnen into the new Kohlgrube water reservoir, situated in the bowl past and below the Müldenlift. Construction was completed in late 2019, leaving insufficient time to fill up totally before the start of last season. The Lift Company can now produce more snow on wider pistes in a much shorter time. Some of the advantages became evident last year when, with the new snow canon, the 2000 opened at the





beginning of the season but from the start of this new season, snow can be produced with far greater reliability. Water storage has been increased by a whopping 80% from 170,000 to 306,000 cubic metres and, at the same time, the high pressure pumping capacity has been upped by a third, from 600 to 900 litres / second. At the right temperature and humidity, basic snowmaking can now be completed in 72 hours.

This is excellent news for us all, a better base makes better skiing – Ski Heil!

Covid19 As we went to press, the Alpbach Lift Company was still waiting for specific quidelines from the Austrian Government:

- Face masks will be mandatory in all enclosed gondolas and covered chairlifts. This means ski lifts can be used to capacity. All gondolas will be regularly disinfected by means of cold misting. The windows of the Gondolas will remain open for continuous ventilation.
- Face masks must also be worn in all enclosed areas as well as queuing/boarding areas, cash desks, entrances and exits.
- Ski Passes can be bought by contactless payment. Guests can order their ski passes at home via the online ticket shop at www. skijuwel.com.

Ski Schools will adhere to these rules and mountain restaurants will provide table service only.

Lift Closure Please note the lifts will be closing on the 11th April 2021.

# Junior Training Report 2020

The 2020 children's training was again extremely popular with 84 children participating in the Half Term week, keeping us all on our toes.

This year it fell in the same week as other international holidays, putting the ski school under enormous pressure. Nevertheless, Sepp arranged a great team of instructors and, despite slightly higher class sizes than normal, we managed to put the groups together accounting for similar ages and abilities.

The slopes this year were in excellent condition but the weather was unusually sunny and warm, in many ways feeling like an Easter training week. Sadly not as many off-piste opportunities as we often do get. Nevertheless, the instructors mixed things up with a little pole training, some having a go at snow blades and all the usual skiing through the fun park and the rollers under the Gmah. The instructors also video their groups with playback during lunch sessions: this is such a valuable learning tool, which most children in ski schools around the Alps never experience. If not quite off-piste powder, there was certainly some off-piste adventure and you'll see a lot of happy faces on this particular run past the mountain farms:



And it's ok, the children weren't involved in this round.

This year some new experienced dry slope racers from 2KPerformance Ski Club at Rossendale joined us, one of the fathers being a former AVSC trainee. While we now no longer offer competitive race training, we do 'push' the groups on their all-round skiing ability and the mixing in of some race trained individuals helped bring everyone's standard up a level. As we have said before, the magic that the AVSC has found is providing ski training that the children really enjoy, yet the natural competitive



spirit of the children brings the best of them out. Every year we see strong improvement and that's why we have the 'most improved' category at prize giving. This year the class winners were Oliver Harwood, Max Arnold, Ava Harper-Hill, Leila Herbig, Louis Petit and Jessica Fitzgerald; with both Leila and Louis nominated as Class Most Improved for two years running. And the overall most improved were Olivia Galbraith and William Nichols. The most rewarding part of the week is seeing this progress and the huge smiles on all the faces at the prize giving – well done to all of you.

Race day delivered some decent weather, so we gave the children a packed lunch at the bottom of the slope so that they could watch their parents battle it out in the Open race afterwards(!). As ever, we set a full race course down the Inneralpbach slope starting from the hut opposite the Böglalm including our youngest trainees (7-8 years old); a formidable effort.

Starting with our youngsters, we have some real stars of the future; Gigi Davies (7) topped Marcus's group in a time of 58.45 with George Haines (8) winning Alastair's group in a time of 59.14. It will be hard to stop these two racing up the groups as they get older. Congratulations too, to the other group winners Heath Ward, Josh Dittmer, both Ava and Jack Harper-Hill and Aimee Johnson. And to our club champions for 2020 - Darcy Davies in a time of 51.91 (at the ripe old age of 10!) and Adam Griffin in a cracking 46.79. It was good to see Telford Ski Club, who train separately in Alpbach, joining us again for the end of week races with some good results.

Our great thanks to Sepp and the Alpbach Ski School for their on-going partnership and to our instructor team led by the ageless Gerhard supported by Freddee, Victoria, Marcus, Rita, Eva, Charlotte, Alistair and Bianca. Thanks also to Joey, our Club Secretary, who is such a help in the village and for arranging AVSC T-shirts for the children at very late notice. Also to Tom Clarke who helped us out at all events and manned the kit sales. Thanks also to the Ast and Gunther who have our children for lunch and to the team at the Böglalm for continuing to give the children their weekly highlight – rôtisserie chicken! Your AVSC co-ordinators on the slopes were Mike, Stewart and Lucy.



Half Term next year will be significantly dictated by where we are with the virus. At the time of going to press, the Austrian Government had not issued specific guidelines for gondolas and ski schools. We are in touch with Sepp and the Lift Company and have been assured that Alpbach will introduce procedures to protect all those using the lifts and the ski schools will have measures in place to safeguard us all. Much can change between now and February but, as things stand, we are planning a full normal season and we look forward to seeing you all again for the Half Term and/ or Easter training weeks.


# Club Weekend Report 2020

# Amateur Inter-Club Championships

Flaine: racing report

This was an AICC which will be remembered for the best of reasons and for the worst. Firstly, let's get the important bit out of the way; We won!

We put one team in the men's 60+ category and our victory was emphatic, finishing with more than seven seconds advantage over Kandahar, as our team raced brilliantly and consistently over all three races. Sadly, the Italian and Austrian teams were late withdrawals due to the gathering severity of the virus in their ski resorts.

The over 60's team this year was bolstered by the addition of two youngsters who have now made the transition to the elite generation: John Ferguson captained the team with his usual skill and ability to order drinks and Richard Gower moved up to join Pablo Ettinger and Jorge Bocca in this category. Sadly the youngsters did not manage to pull together a team this year, and there was a dearth of females as well, but this magnificent win will act as a rallying cry for next year when we hope to send a full complement of teams to Wengen.

The AICC races were held this year in Flaine and organised very competently by The Ladies Ski Club who claim to be the oldest ski club in Europe. Flaine of course is not noted for its' architectural heritage although the skiing, which is really in one large bowl, is not to be underestimated. The dedicated race pistes were excellent and the local ski club ran all three days with professionalism and good humour.

Other than Jorge, who clearly felt that training was neither necessary nor a good use of energy, the team arrived in time for some training on the Wednesday afternoon, running gates and getting to know the terrain. As a result of the expected weather getting worse, the Super G was switched to the first day of racing on the Thursday which consisted of just one run through a fast and full-length course.

There was no doubting the sartorial elegance of the AVSC team who were all wearing the club race suits. John was the first down and made it look simple, and was in lead position when he finished. Jorge followed him down having got to Flaine shortly before the race started and made a respectable time. Sadly, Pablo's return to racing, after some surgery a few weeks previous, proved to be a leisurely outing and it was left to Richard to tear up the course, thereby beating John by 4 hundredths of a second and coming in second overall.

That evening we dined and danced in two different mountain restaurants, being ferried by snowcat between the two, oblivious to the global pandemic which was starting to rage in many parts of Europe. Before dinner we were treated to a motivational talk by Chemmy Alcott, a long time member of the Ladies Ski Club.

The following day, was made up of two runs of the Giant Slalom in rather foggy conditions which, with hindsight, might have been an advantage for us. Once again, John and Richard both had excellent runs and were in first and second

position with half a second separating them. Pablo, fortified by 1000mg of a legal drug, produced a much stronger run than the previous day and came in sixth place whilst Jorge produced another solid anchor result. The second run was equally consistent, but John pulled out an extra hidden reserve and was first overall by nearly two seconds, with Richard in third place and the fortified Pablo not that far behind! With the best of three results counting, we had increased our category lead over the two days.

So the gold in the over 60's category went to AVSC and John proudly lead the team onto the podium that night where, once again, we partied as if Europe was not about to go into lockdown. The following day of free skiing was interrupted by the news that all ski resorts would close THAT evening, so we had skied the final day of



the 2020 season. An extraordinary end to a strange season and one which will not be forgotten.

Next year the races are in Wengen on the 11th -14th March, organised by the DHO. The Super G will be held on the famous Lauberhorn racetrack so that will be something definitely not to be missed.






# at the AJ Bell Courmayeur Classic

Both Jenny Ferguson and I had already discussed and agreed with Dan Charlish, Director and Founder of Snow-Camp, that we would enter the inaugural AJ Bell Courmayeur Classic, a multi-discipline snowsports event set to test enthusiastic skiers (like us!), raise money for an amazing charity and have lots of fun in the process. Scouting the deck for support, we approached two willing 'volunteers' John Harris and Miranda Gillott and the Alpbach Allstars were born.

Fast forward to 31st January in Courmayeur and we found ourselves lined up with 12 other teams, ready for a mass Le Mans start to launch the event. Day One consisted of three challenges: the Snowshoe Hike, Laser Biathlon and Team Orienteering.

At the laser biathlon, it would be fair to say that two of us were simply hopeless! Jenny and I were unable to hit a thing, either due to hyper-ventilation from the skating beforehand or just a woeful lack of talent. Thankfully, John was a good shot and Miranda held her own. We then moved to the snowshoe hike - up the side of a mountain, through the trees and back down again - where John, realising that this involved seriously hard climbing, managed to come adrift from his snow shoe, thus earning a technical rest, and we could only limp to the finish. The rest of the day was spent whizzing around the mountain hunting for 30 checkpoints and then recording each check point with a group

photo and the checkpoint number in view – much easier said than done! We collected 26 out of 30 checkpoints and ended the first day in the middle of the leader board. The Alpbach Allstars were looking anything but stars! We enjoyed a gregarious dinner with the other competitors that evening but we had a substantial task ahead of us.

Day Two started with the Parallel Slalom. Race commentary given by Snow-Camp patrons and Ski Sunday presenters Graham Bell and Chemmy Alcott, adding an extra level of authenticity, fun and excitement to the day. We were fortunate enough to win this event and realised if we could manage one simple task, ski fast for two hours, we might just emerge with our honour intact. GPS tracker onboard and a cunning plan in mind, Jenny, our team captain, put John out in front with two simple instructions: 'Ski fast and do not stop! We will keep up!' John duly rose to the challenge and we scrambled after him, desperate not to lose him in the mist, bouncing from bump to bump as we went, skiing at our limit in the flat light. We crossed the finish line in one piece, with a winning distance of 35km,





and then enjoyed excellent apres-ski and dancing before being escorted home via the gondola.

There was a wonderful awards dinner that evening and a great sense of camaraderie amongst the teams. A friendly rivalry had built up during the event between the Alpbach Allstars and Team Delanski, long-term supporters of Snow-Camp's work. Team Delanski were deservedly awarded the Top Fundraiser Trophy, setting an amazing precedent for the years to follow. We thought they might take the double but our efforts on the last day pushed us to the top and so the Alpbach Allstars became the overall Event Winners, taking the first ever AJ Bell Courmayeur Classic title.

I cannot recommend this event more highly. Snow-Camp's organisation of the event and the location were faultless. The opportunity to ski fast and compete in different events, all with a winter sports theme, was a new challenge and one that we thoroughly enjoyed. It is important to remember that this event is also about fund-raising for a unique and wonderful charity that deserves the support of everyone who skis. As competitors, we cover the costs of the event through our entry fees so any sponsorship funds raised as a result of our efforts goes directly to the Snow-Camp programmes for young people.

As we go to print, there is a slight question mark over winter sports this season but should we get the opportunity to compete again, the Alpbach Allstars are resolved to meet a stretching fundraising target and to do our upmost to retain the AJ Bell Courmayeur Classic title. 


